### Lucy D. Rosenfeld to exhibit collages

Artist Lucy D. Rosenfeld will exhibit her collages at the Edward Williams Gallery on Fairleigh Dickinson University's Metropolitan campus from now until Jan. 4, 2008.

The gallery will be closed for winter break on Dec. 23 and reopen on Jan. 2, 2008.

Rosenfeld's collages, which explore the use of "found" papers of different types to create the accidental convergence of color and texture, will be the focus of the exhibit.

"Collage is something I find endlessly stimulating because it combines so many aspects of contemporary art," she said. "I am interested in color and spatial relationships and how interaction between them creates rhythm and depth and ambiguity."

Largely based on nature, her collages also touch on the abstract and in her words "suggest rather than imitate the natural world." Her collages and watercolors have been featured at The Waver-

ly Gallery in New York City, the Schlesinger Center at Harvard University, Amherst College and Sarah Lawrence College.

Author of more than 26 books,

Rosenfeld has written on 20th century sculpture, Far Eastern art and art deco, as well as guides to public art and gardens.

She is presently completing a book for Schiffer Publishing Ltd. titled "The Architect's Garden," which will explore how architects design the space around contemporary buildings.

The Gallery in FDU's Edward Williams Hall is located at 150 Kotte Place, Hackensack. Gallery hours are Monday through Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Saturday 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The exhibit is free and open to the public.
